This dissertation presents a grounded theory that explains the process by which 100 senior executives of a multinational holding company were able to emotionally re-engage with the company and with each other over the course of a 5 day journey. In doing so this dissertation is attempting to answer the question of how to create spaces where the leaders of an organization can meet each other in life-giving ways for themselves and the organizations they are part of. This dissertation contributes to the field of Organizational Development by highlighting the importance of emotional engagement among executives to successfully drive processes of organizational change and transformation.
